Over the past several Sundays, we've been working our way through Paul's letter to Philippi, and as we have moved through the letter, we see an overarching theme of transformation in and through Christ. Throughout Paul's letter, he invites us, body and soul, to experience "*encouragement in Christ ... consolation from love ... fellowship (Koinonia) in the Spirit ... compassion, sympathy*-the glory of living that is Christ."



Many in our congregation have been praying for transformation, for change of heart and spirit. We have been persistent in our prayers for ourselves and for the church we love. We have not given up when things seemed bleak. And those prayers are - YES! - being answered! Arms are opening wide in welcome. Hearts are opening wide to strangers. Eyes are opening wide to seeing what new things God is doing in the world. Ears are opening wide to God's call in each of our own lives. We are seeing the results! ... when we get out of our own way by emptying ourselves of our need for control and look instead to the interests of others. These practices flow from our deepening relationship with Christ. Over time as we become more practiced at asking ourselves the question, "What would Jesus have me do?" we see that in living out the answers, we become more open to what God is calling us to be and to do in the world.

Sometimes, I'll admit, when we read that Jesus emptied himself (Philippians 2:1-12), we think, "Oh, that was Jesus ... That wasn't God ... and that's certainly not me!" We try to shield ourselves from the idea that even God empties God's self ... We try to separate Jesus from God and forget that God's nature is also Jesus' nature. And we protest that there's no way we can ever be

Christ-like "enough." First, in the creation story, we see the very character of God: "All of God's acts, blessings, and delights in creating are for others." God is dramatically invested in life on earth. God is love. Having God's nature, Jesus - God with us - Immanuel - shows us the way of love, justice and joy, sensitivity to the vulnerabilities and sufferings of others. When we allow ourselves to be obedient to the call of Christ, we also visit, feed, aid, embrace, and speak truth fearlessly, even when obedience means death ... death to our own ego, to our own need for control, to our own demands. We are able to empty ourselves to the degree that we are able to be concerned for others beyond our own self-interest, beyond obsession with achievements and guilt over failures, beyond self itself!

And I see it happening in this congregation!

We are growing in our spiritual experience together! By actively participating in this community of faith with each other - with grace, mutual respect, and compassion - we are living the reality that nothing can separate us from God's love.

And to God be the Glory!

May the fullness of God be within you until you can't NOT keep yourself from answering God's call on your life to share God's love and grace anywhere and everywhere.

"The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit" (Philemon 1:20).

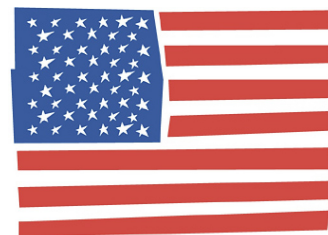

letter from presbytery

SESSION NOTES

Session decided at the September 20, 2011 meeting:

1. To approve the transfer of membership for Cliff and Donita O'Donnell from the Covenant Presbyterian Church, Madison, Wisconsin
2. To allow the property committee to oversee the disposal of one old large desk.
3. To have a called meeting of session on October 8 to study the issues coming before the October 28-29 meeting of Mission Presbytery in Victoria.
4. To appoint Anna Bohart and Bill Bohart as commissioners to Presbytery in Victoria - October 28 & 29.
5. For the October 9, 2011, called congregational meeting: To elect three members to serve on the nominating committee to nominate elders and trustees for the class of 2014.
6. For the October 9, 2011, called congregational meeting: To dissolve the current Co-Pastor Model and revert to the Solo Pastor/Head of Staff model. If approved, to then confirm and affirm Linda Whitworth-Reed as Solo Pastor/Head of Staff under the Terms of call to be presented to the congregation at this meeting. If the congregation confirms and affirms Linda Whitworth-Reed as Solo Pastor, her Terms of Call shall take effect upon review and approval of Mission Presbytery's Committee on Ministry (COM). As per the Book of Order, these are the only items that may be voted upon at this called meeting. All votes cast on these two items shall be via written ballots.
7. (Due to the summer absence of the chair of the nominating committee):
To reduce the elder classes from 5 to 4 and to change the session year from January-December to June-May. This means that all those now serving on session will stay on until the May following the end of their current class. (i.e. the class of 2011 continues until May 2012). Also to elect the new class of elders no more than 120 days prior to their being installed.
8. To sponsor the classes held by Kids n Cloud Arts for outreach into the community so that the classes could be promoted within McAllen ISD.
9. To approve the replacement of the doors in the Narthex area to be paid out of the memorial fund.
10. To purchase a new buffer polisher to be paid out of the money donated by Bill Wilson.
11. To approve \$3000 of designated money to be used by the choir for section leaders and special music.
12. To approve a continuing education class for Linda Whitworth-Reed on family systems which meets monthly in San Antonio and to allow Linda to rearrange her schedule accordingly.

Session received, with regret, the resignation of Mark Magee.

Being around little ones totally changes that perspective. They live only in the moment, whether it is joyous or sad. But either one may only last a moment.

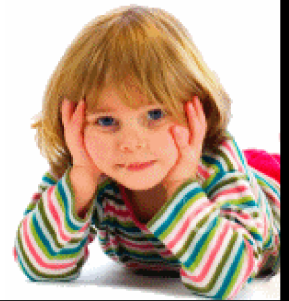
Listening to their sounds causes one to think more about this minute. Getting from it what God wants us to get and giving to it all we can to make it special for us and others around us.
